Contemporary literature, interesting places, familiar faces: this is a literary happening called the Literature Night, which, in attractive or commonly inaccessible places brings excerpts from European writers' new books, presented by well-known actors, to the general public. A unique combination of an unusual place, distinctive interpretation and literary text offers a unique cultural experience and an opportunity to learn about contemporary European authors' thinking. Indeed, the Literature Night event has become an integral part of the Czech cultural scene. Its target group is not strictly defined; the project is intended for the general public and includes all age and social groups. It is a non-profit event and admission is free.

The Literature Night project is organized by the Czech Centres in cooperation with EUNIC (Association of National Cultural Institutes of EU Countries), foreign embassies, and the Labyrinth publishing house. The aim of the event is to increase public interest in contemporary European fiction showing its art forms and creativity. Moreover, it highlights the importance of multilingualism and the value of translating from large and small languages.

This year, reading chapters from selected works presented 19 contemporary authors from 18 participating countries in Czech translation; Romani literature was included for the second time. The project is regularly held on the eve of the Book World festival; as usual, this year the audience had the opportunity to meet, during the Literature Night, some of the authors who came to the Book World Prague 2019.

The Czech Centers have been organizing the event since 2006. Six years ago, the Association of Librarians and Information Workers (SKIP) joined the project, and the number of cities participating in it is increasing every year: this year there were more than 60 throughout the Czech Republic.

In addition, numerous European and non-European cities participate in the Literature Night. The project is gradually expanding and has become a cultural event with international reach.

- The Literature Night is a European project and, in 2019, it brought some new themes related to important anniversaries:
  - 30 years since the Velvet Revolution
  - 10 years of the Eastern Partnership Treaty
  - 15 years after joining the EU
- Great attention was paid to translation and translators, especially in the form of a Facebook campaign. At the Café Evropa in the Book World venue, a discussion panel on the topic of supporting translation activities was held.
- Ukraine participated in the Literature Night 2019.
- For the second time, Romani literature was included thanks to the support offered by the Goethe-Institut and Norwegian Funds
- The Czech Post became a partner in 2019; it facilitated the realization of the Literature Night for Children in Prague.

### IV LITERATURE NIGHT IN PRAGUE May 9th 2019 Prague 2 – Albertov, Karlov, Vyšehrad, Podskalí, Nové Město

During the Literature Night in Prague, literature always comes to life in a different district, which also co-organizes the whole event. In 2019 it was Prague 2.

This year, 30 years will have passed since the Velvet Revolution. The Literature Night in Prague commemorated the November events by selecting reading spots on the way that partially copied the student march route on November 17, 1989. Therefore, the nineteen unusual and very diverse reading venues were situated in Albertov, Karlov, Vyšehrad and Nové Město, all in Prague 2.



For many visitors, especially from the younger generation, many reading venues were rather unknown; it is no surprise that the connection of the Literature Night route with the student march route of November 17, 1989, was considered very intriguing. Truly, to remind that event was one of this year's Literature Night's goals. As part of a partnership with the Czech Post, which supported this year's Literature Night, the first annual Literature Night for Children took place at the Na Slupi Botanical Garden in the afternoon. During the afternoon, children could do many things: join interactive workshops led by FFUK and DAMU students; design and draw postage stamps and send them to a contest; make their own small garden models in a glass; look at children's books by European authors; listen to fairy tales; and sing songs. The Polish Institute in Prague and the Jakost publishing house were also partners of the children's event.

### LITERATURE NIGHT 2019 AND MEDIA RELATIONS

Despite the growing popularity of social networks and media, the reach of traditional media - press, television, radio and online news sites – is still wide. Over the years, a team of project organizers has managed to establish relationships with major media houses and public media. Thanks to this, the target group of interested parties has been successfully addressed. In addition to other titles (see the overview of media responses), this year's co-operation has expanded to include some media aimed at children as well (more in the Czech Post section, a partner of Literature Night 2019). Given the focus of the brand-new programme, it was also possible to make the project more visible in children's magazines and magazines aimed at the 3+ target group. Last but not least, this year we also managed to ensure massive support by some regional media.

All available communication channels, including outdoor advertising or accompanying PR activities, were used in the project's effective communication. In addition to the already proven formats, two other events were added this year: Open Day in the Czernin Palace, organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and Europe Day, organized by the European Commission. As a result, the project's communication platform expanded and, through direct communication with the public, the base of interested parties expanded, too.

### CZECH POST, PARTNER OF LITERATURE NIGHT 2019

This year, the Czech Post became a partner of the Literature Night for the first time. Thanks to a special event promoting this partner and the Literature Night 2019, the participants also included the group "parents with children from 3 to 15 years". The Literature Night for Children took place on Thursday, May 9, 13.00 - 18.00, at the Botanical Garden, Na Slupi 433/16, Prague 2. The workshops offered were focused on diverse interests of child readers according to various age groups.

# PRESS RELEASES

Public relations are among our prominent promotional goals. Over the years, the Literature Night has become a distinctive brand that, in the eyes of the public, should be automatically associated with the institution. Over the past thirteen years, it has sought to gain public interest, favour and popularity by creating a favourable climate. From the marketing point of view, the monitoring of public relations has intensified with time: all significant references and articles presented in the media, with direct or indirect impact on the Literature Night brand, which overlap with the Czech Centres have been registered. Advertising covers selected radio stations and printed and electronic media, namely newspapers and magazines. It is realized exclusively in the form of barter co-operation.




When communicating the project, great emphasis was placed on working with social networks. The number of fans grew steadily. Over the period under review (27 March–27 May 2019), there was an increase by 321 fans ( $5037 \rightarrow 5358$ ); he biggest increase was recorded on the day of the event. Up to now, the Literature Night page has registered 5378 fans and 5576 followers.







This year, an important part of the Literature Night's promotion was a video campaign aimed at translators. Oliver Procházka, a university student, made 19 short video portraits of individual translators; these mini-portraits, where the translators introduced their books briefly, were included in this year's programme. The first video was published on March 19, 2019, and the last on May 7, 2019. According to responses, this campaign had an impact on both selecting a reading venue during the event and taking interest in a particular book.





The most effective contribution reached 8461 people.






Photos made by 3 photographers were published and shared during the event. The most successful post had 76 likes.



Even abroad, the Literature Night project takes place under the auspices of the Czech Centres. Thanks to cooperation with partners, public readings were held in thirty seven cities on three continents. In Slovakia the event was held in 18 cities, and in Bulgaria in 11 cities.


